

Monthly Reflection

"The Lord is my Shepherd"

I recently attempted to sing (not solo!) at the Songs of Praise Service for Broughty Ferry Gala Week at St Luke's the well-known Psalm 23 - "The Lord's my Shepherd". However, the tune was Orlington and not Crimond! I cannot recall how many years when I last attempted to sing "The Lord's my Shepherd" to the tune Orlington. However, whether you sing the Psalm 23 to Orlington, Crimond, Wiltshire, or Brother James's Air, the message of Psalm 23 is still the same and it is – "The Lord is my Shepherd".

Yes, we look to Jesus Christ as our Shepherd. Even for those of us who have never met a shepherd, we know shepherds are there to look after their sheep. When I was training for the ministry, I did a placement at Durness, Sutherland, and I met several shepherds and their sheep dogs. It was good training for this urbanite and future minister.

Jesus Christ is our Shepherd, but he wants each of us to be shepherds too. We are all called to be shepherds in various ways within the family of God's people. Shepherds offer the example of service to their sheep. We are called to be of service by Jesus Christ our Shepherd.

A group of pilgrims were visiting the Holy Land and saw a flock of sheep being herded up a village street by a man at the back with a big stick. One of the pilgrims asked the tour guide, "Isn't the shepherd supposed to walk ahead as a guide?" "Ah," said the guide. "That's not the shepherd; that's the butcher!" The simple response to this story is surely - Lord, make me a shepherd, not a butcher!

We are called to service by Jesus Christ to be good shepherds who offer our service with all our gifts and talents to Christ and His Kirk.

Let us pray. Dear Lord, help us to call two ministers to our church who will be true shepherds to your people. In your grace, may we all in our diverse ways be shepherds to each other, through the one true Shepherd of us all Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
