
## BFPC Eco congregation group

You might have seen the sign "CH\_\_CH. What's missing? UR!" It expresses one popular view of the church's mission, but it is only one aspect. The Church of Scotland has identified Five Marks of Mission for congregations to consider, and they are quite wide-ranging.

- Proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom
- · Teach, baptise and nurture new believers
- Respond to human need by loving service
- Transform unjust structures of society, challenge violence of every kind, pursue peace and reconciliation
- Strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of earth

These are not a re-invention of the church's role - they are seen all the way through the Bible, and in Jesus's life! OK, his care for the environment is not specifically mentioned, but most (or all) of the incidents recorded in the gospels can be put into one of the other four categories. His ministry was preaching the Good News, training his followers, healing and loving people, and challenging the religious leaders. However, caring for God's creation was the first responsibility given to the man and the woman in Eden, and it hasn't been rescinded!

If you have looked at our Parish Profile, you will have been encouraged at how much Broughty Ferry Parish Church is already doing towards these Marks of mission. But we have aspirations. We could do more, and we all have a part to play in each of these Marks, although most of us will have a bigger role in some Marks than in others.

Probably the one Mark we would all say is most important for the church is also the one we find hardest - proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom. We all feel inadequate. We don't know all the answers. Our lives don't match up to what we believe. Yet we do show something of what we believe, whether we like it or not, by what we say and do. You can probably tell what hobbies or sport a person follows without them having to tell you. The same should be true for us as Christians. Most of us aren't expected to go around preaching about our faith, but there may be times we do need to talk about what we believe. "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone," Paul says in Colossians 4:6. Nor do we need to know all the answers - it is not an exam we have to pass. We simply need to talk about what we do know.

As well as our individual involvement in proclaiming the Good News, as a church we need to be thinking about how we proclaim the Good News. Our new mission group and our new ministers will help us to do this, but we all need to support them since they can't do it all. Also, any one of us might notice something that we could try doing as a church.

Over the summer a friend told me the following story: A church decided to set up angling club. They knew that they had a pond in their grounds and there were fish in it, so they put a net in their pond and waited for the fish to jump in. From time to time they checked their net, but found that they caught nothing.

They then decided to be more ambitious. They had also noticed that there was a stream that ran right past the church, and they thought there must be some fish in the stream. They decided to be pro-active and bought rods and bait, and dangled their lines into the stream. From time to time they changed their bait, or fished a different stretch of the stream, but they only managed to catch one or two fish.

So they thought about it again and asked "Where are the fish?" Some were in the pond, and some were also in the stream. But where were most of the fish? Suddenly they realised, THE SEA! Therefore, they planned a trip to the sea, hired a boat, and went fishing. A few of their members did suffer from sea-sickness, but they caught many fish.

That story might be something for us to think about. After all, Jesus told his first disciples "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people".

# Broughty Ferry Parish Church Communication Update August 2024

The BFPC Communication (on behalf of KS) wish to update you on the progresses that have been made

We are delighted that the Nominating Committee have invited Rev Lorna Tunstall to preach as Sole Nominee with regard to one of the vacant Ministerial positions at Broughty Ferry Parish Church. Procedural requirements have been completed and Rev Tunstall has accepted the invitation. Lorna will preach at St Stephen's and West Church at 10.00 on Sunday 8 September, and then at Queen Street East at 11.30 that day. (Please note change to normal worship time to accommodate Lorna preaching at both services). After each service, the congregations will be invited to vote in favour or not of Rev Tunstall and the two ballots will be combined and counted as one, in front of the combined Kirk Sessions immediately following the 11.30 service at QSE while refreshments are served in the hall. The result will be announced thereafter and repeated at Intimations on 15th September. Subject to the nomination and acceptance, the Call for Service will be opened on 15th September to all those on the Communion Roll and will be open for 2 weeks – details to be announced if appropriate.

We are grateful to all those who have already put their names down to populate the groups which will organise Mission and Management of our church and who have been attending initial meetings held in the last six weeks to identify Conveners & Sub conveners and evaluate the proposed remits. BFPC Kirk Session will ratify nominations and remit proposals when they meet on 17th September and then the work can begin properly.

While some groups are quite well populated, there are some that need more help, so we would ask your consideration to potentially find out more if you are able to volunteer some time towards the work of the church. There are particular vacancies in the groups which make up the Management Board - Facilities Management; People & Compliance (including Health & Safety); Property & Grounds, Stewardship & Finance. Also there are vacancies in the areas of Communication and Adult Education. If you are interested in getting involved in any of these, please let Ken Andrew know (sessionclerk@bfpc.scot).

We have been advertising for a new Church Administrator/ Secretary and a Facilities Administrator and there has been interest expressed in both posts. The closing date for applications is 30<sup>th</sup> August. We are therefore hopeful these vacancies will be filled soon. Our present secretary, Alison Tonner, is retiring in October after many years faithful service.

Harvest Sunday – The worship group have decided to have Harvest Thanksgiving services in both churches on 29<sup>th</sup> September. The preachers for that week will work together on hymns and readings so we can celebrate in a similar way despite being in different locations. We will be welcoming donations for Dundee & Angus Foodbank – their present shopping list is - tinned fruit, UHT milk, tinned meat, tea bags but any donations welcomed.

The intention is to deliver the flowers which will decorate the church to the Care homes where we have congregational residents, the elderly and housebound – volunteers to do this would be welcomed at both churches.

Finally, a call out for communication. We are striving to improve communication across the congregation and into the community. The Website (www.bfpc.scot) and Facebook are updated regularly and we would encourage you to take a look if you are able. We have recently instigated an Instagram account and, though it is early days and a time of trial and error. We are still keen to have as many email addresses as possible so that we can keep in touch. If you are unsure we have the best mode of communication for you, please pick up a form at the church door and hand it to a Welcomer at the door.
